





HOUSE OF HOPE

The House of Hope in Northwest Kenya continues to be a refuge for at-risk children from ages 4 to 18. Our 19 staff members provide a current total of 72 children and young people with a safe, healthy environment, Christian teaching, instruction in basic life skills, education, meals, health care, and psychological support. This “place of happiness,” as one young resident calls it, is making a daily difference in the lives of boys and girls who come from unbearable living conditions. Their hope is a direct result of the generosity of partners like you who sponsor and pray for each child by name, giving them hope for the present and for eternity as they learn about the saving work of Jesus Christ. In October 2021, we welcomed 10 new children into the House of Hope. Because of our loving supporters, all 10 children were fully sponsored within 4 weeks!

Now when young people graduate from the House of Hope program, a new chapter begins. Thanks to our individual and corporate donors, SERV was able to open the START Transition Home in July 2021. The START Transition Home is a place for youth aging out of House of Hope at ages 18 and above to start their adult life, either by finishing high school, attending a 2-year term trade school, or going to college. START Transition Home invests in youth by helping them take the next steps toward their future. This extension of our House of Hope ministry is a direct result of SERV supporters' prayers and generosity.


JOSHUA EKARAN

One elderly woman we met in the country of Jordan lost her husband before they had any children. Because of a cultural stigma against remarriage, no one would marry her after she was widowed. Since then, she has lived a very lonely life. When we visited her, we sat and talked for a while, and she explained that this was the first time she had seen any living soul in 2 weeks. She talked about how she feared that she would die in her home and no one would find her body. She feared that no one would care that she would be gone. We sat and prayed with her and told her that she is always welcome at our local partner church. We promised that whenever we can, we will send a home visit team out to visit and fellowship with her.

In early 2021, we had the opportunity to partner with a local ministry called “Go Ye Peru International Ministries.” Their core mission is to bring hope to the people of Peru. Through this partnership, we were able to feed four different communities in Carabayllo, Lima. That’s a total of 1,178 families (3,534 individuals) that received food. We were also able to see 141 adults and children accept Christ!



SERV distributed 1,000,000 meals throughout Cuba in 2021. We were able to bless many families with healthy, nourishing food in a time of sickness and economic hardship across the country.



To maintain the security and safety of the families we serve, we are unable to share any details of our ministry here that could identify them or our team. Poverty is prevalent in Afghanistan. Because of inflation, the people here face hardships to provide even the most basic necessities for their families. They cannot afford basic foods like salt, sugar, and flour, let alone healthcare and needed medications. No parent should have to decide which child to sell in order to sustain the rest of their family. Due to cultural norms, it is especially difficult for widowed women to take care of themselves and their children. In addition, many elderly people suffer neglect as their families are not able to care for them.


In July 2021, we were able to transport 500,000 meals into the Democratic Republic of Congo. When a volcano erupted in Goma, North Kivu, thousands of families were displaced. D. R. Congo has one of the highest rates of internal displacement in the world. While there, our team was able to partner with local churches to strategically distribute the food throughout the camps. Individuals with disabilities were among the most vulnerable, so we directed our outreach to them. Through outreach and partnerships with the local churches, we saw 1,009 salvations.

YOUR SUPPORT SERVED OUR STATE

Our reach within our community has only expanded over the past year. Including Cherokee County, we have distributed SERV food boxes into 10 Georgia counties.

On March 26, 2021, a devastating EF4 tornado swept through the town of Newnan, Georgia, about 70 miles from our SERV headquarters. Over 1,700 homes were damaged and thousands of lives were affected. SERV sent a volunteer team to the “ground zero” building where supplies were collected for families, some of whom had lost everything. SERV was able to contribute 400 food boxes to meet the immediate need of feeding the people of Newnan.

Beyond our reach with our SERV food boxes, we closely work with other organizations that allow us to distribute fresh produce. Through this avenue, in 2021 we were able to distribute 558,901 pounds of fresh produce to partner organizations. Through this effort, we were able to reach another 62,447 individuals in the state of Georgia!



DID YOU KNOW?

NOW YOU CAN SERVE BY DONATING CRYPTOCURRENCY AND STOCK!

Donating Crypto or stock is an easy way to support SERV that also allows you to save on taxes. Donating these assets directly to a 501c3 nonprofit is more tax-efficient and can save you money. The IRS classifies cryptocurrency and stock as property for tax purposes, which means it is typically the most tax-efficient way to support any organization. When donating, you receive a tax deduction for the fair market value of the asset, and you avoid the capital gains tax you would incur if you had sold the asset and then made a donation. This means you're able to donate more, as well as deduct more on your tax return. The difference can be a savings of more than 30 percent.
